Dear Members and Friends,

It is my pleasure to tell you about all of the exciting changes that have happened at BTS. The synagogue has been a beehive of activity recently due to several capital improvements. Even better, since these are capital projects for the synagogue, the funding is coming from our investment accounts.

- The lower roof has already been redone with a rubber seal ready to support the solar panels that will be installed soon. All has been approved by Eversource and should save us money for electricity.
- Delayed by supply chain issues, the upper roof repair is scheduled to be completed in November.
- A new Carrier HVAC system will be installed in November or December. No more leaky roofs!

We also have continued to add to the safety and security issues that the committee headed by Harvey Jassem was charged to fulfill, as stated by the \$50,000 grant awarded by the State of Connecticut. You will receive a separate letter detailing their efforts. Hard work went into the structure of the grant and the distribution to the appropriate companies to do the work that needed to be done. The Board of Directors was instrumental in deciding to go ahead with these projects in order to improve the building and the comfort that we will achieve when all is done. It's been a few years of great accomplishment with just some left to finish by December.

The Board of Directors also approved a new hybrid technology system that was installed before the 5783 High Holidays and worked well. The cameras, TV screens, high quality audio system and equipment will make in person and online services much easier to provide. This project was possible with funds from the investments due to its capital status.

All of these projects were necessary to keep the building updated; to make sure we are as safe and secure as possible; and to continue to enjoy worshipping and studying together. Barry Goldberg and Harvey Jassem led the committees that brought these critical building changes to fruition. This has been a lot of work to accomplish, and I know that we are all grateful for everything they have done on our behalf. I am also grateful that we have a wonderful Rabbi, Administrative Office Manager, Communication Coordinator, and an all-around good guy on our side. Rabbi Debra Cantor, Maria daCunha, Terry Wolfisch Cole and Steve Motley are the best at what they do, and I'm glad they do it here for us.

BTS does a lot for a small synagogue. Please come and share yourselves with each other. Are you ready? We are emerging slowly from a tough over two-year time period, and we need our community in order to continue the wonderful services, programs and events that we've always had. We need each other.

Dear Members and Friends,

Security and Safety have been uppermost in our planning for our return to the synagogue. The Security Committee, headed by Harvey Jassem, has been following through on hiring companies to install all of the necessary upgrades that were outlined in the security grant that we were awarded. Here are a few of the highlights:

- There are new much more secure doors to the outside at the end of the hallway near the kitchen and in the library.
- The alarm system has been improved.
- Security cameras were installed outside and inside the building.
- Emergency telephones are stationed in various places throughout the synagogue; in the lobby, the chapel, the sanctuary, the social hall and the women's restroom.
- Signage has been improved to better denote emergency exits, the AED and first aid kits.
- We have "hardened the building" in a number of ways—for example, which doors should be locked from the inside.
- Security training has been offered to members and will continue in the coming months.
- We will have a professional security guard on duty for the holidays.

**We feel good about the improvements, but it is important to remember that safety and security are the responsibilities of each of us.**

What you can do:

- ***If you see something that seems suspicious, say something!***
- Use only the front door entrance when arriving and leaving the synagogue.
- Tickets are required for entry. Please remember to bring them. Masks must be worn at all times while in the synagogue.
- If you can avoid bringing anything bulky, please do as bags may be subject to inspection.
- Look around and notice where the emergency exits are located. We have several that aren't as obvious as one might think.
- Keep your cell phone on silent and call 911 if there is an emergency.
- Please join us for upcoming security and safety training sessions.




